Tell us what's bloomed early, or late, or not at all

MAINTENANCE

<u>It's in between time:</u> The early bloomers are almost finished, these you dead head, the later bloomers you feed w/ high phospherous plant food - the middle letter in the NPK formula. You should water all plants while you can. This would be a good year to prune your plants significantly: smaller plants need less water. The best time for pruning is right after blooming finishes.
