SHOW & TELL

Blooming season is starting (don't you love winter in northern California). The early rhodies are coming into bloom, so bring your early blooms to share and inspire other members to also grow early bloomers. Would you like to share other blooming plants in your garden? February doesn't bring us many blooming plants – we need ideas!

MAINTENANCE

Not only is it still cold out — it's also dry, so don't forget to check and make you're your plants are not drying out; water your plants if it hasn't rained for a while. Pick up fallen leaves to prevent mold & mildew spores and thrip eggs from becoming permanent residents in your garden. Don Wallace of Singing Tree Gardens suggests feeding your plants at this time with a high phosphorus fertilizer (high middle number in the NPK formula) for bigger, more colorful flowers.
