

MAINTENANCE

Don Wallace of SingingTree Gardens councels us about fertilizing in a recent newsletter. Mid-Feb is one of the 2 times a year he fertilizes his plants. This feeding should be high in potasseum (middle letter in NPK formula) to promote bigger flowers (and we all want big flowers). Here is a quick & easy check for soil acidity: Put some of your garden soil in a small container; pour some vinegar on it. If it fizzes - you have acidic soil. Take another small amount soil & put it in a small container. Add some baking soda mixed with water; if it fizzes - your soil is alkeline. If your soil doesn't fizz in either experiment, your soil is neutral. For rhodies & azaleas you need your soil to be slightly acidic. I found this experiment on the internet - so you know it must be true;)
