Bring what's blooming in your gardens to share

MAINTENANCE

I love to get Don Wallace's (Singing Tree Gardens Nursery) weekly newsletter. He usually has helpful hints for feeding & maintaining rhododendrons & azaleas. His latest tip is:

It's Time to Feed Your Rhododendrons

The 2 main feeding times that we recommend for rhododendrons are Valentine's Day and Father's Day. This does not mean you have to feed on these exact days...we just use these holidays to help us remember when the fertilizer should be applied. The Valentine's Day feeding is to give your plants the necessary energy to produce all of those big, showy blooms. It has been said that this winter feeding will increase the size and depth of color of rhododendron flowers, increase the length of the bloom, and make your plants stronger. Along with that, the leaves will darken and become more shiny. We recommend 1 cup of a well balanced, time release fertilizer around the drip line of plants 3 feet tall or less, and 1 1/2 to 2 cups for larger plants. Use your best judgment, as some old, much larger plants may need more. If you can toss some good bark mulch over the fertilizer, your plants will get more of the food and the bark will help prevent weed germination.

Another of Don's tips is to sprinkle about a hand full of Epsom Salts around the base of your plants, and then water, to green up the leaves
