SHOW & TELL

With no rain last year and a very warm fall, are your rhodies' blooming times out of sinc? Did some of your trusses bloom early, only to be beaten down by the storms in Dec? Bring samples of what's blooming in your garden now, that usually blooms in March and April, so we can compare & see if the same varieties of plants are "out of sinc" in all of our gardens.

MAINTENANCE

We did have some rain, but was it enough to turn the sprinklers off? The first couple of inches of soil may be wet, but dig down a couple inches of more, to see if soil is dry 4 or 5 inches below the top. If it's dry - then don't stop watering. Fortunately, rhododendron roots are shallow, so the first couple of inches of wet soil is great, but this is also the portion which dries out the quickest, so don't be lulled into thinking you're home free - keep an eye out for droopy leaves and browning buds. We are in the middle of January, we still may have additional frosty nights in the next 6 weeks, so when the temeratures get close to freezing, cover those plants, esp maddeniias & vireyas, which are frost tender. Your rhodies could also stand an application of phosphate (high number for the middle letter in the n-p-k formula) to ensure that the buds get properly fed.
