SHOW & TELL

The early rhodies are blooming, and mid-season buds are swelling. This is the time of year we all wait for. Share what plants are blooming in your garden, rhodies, azaleas & others.

MAINTENANCE

Days are getting longer and warmer; more time to garden. It hasn't rained a lot lately so check the ground around your plants and water your plants if necessary. Pick up fallen leaves to prevent mold & mildew spores and thrip eggs from becoming permanent residents in your garden. There's still time to feed your plants with a high phosphorus fertilizer (high middle number in the NPK formula) for bigger, more colorful flowers – especially the later blooming ones. Don't forget – azaleas like to get fed too. Probably everything in your garden would like some nourishment now to ensure a "floweriforous" show.
