MAINTENANCE

March begins in earnest the best time of the year for rhodie lovers. To ensure your buds will keep swelling and bursting into bloom, don't forget to water. Although we had some rain this last month, we are still experiencing a drought. Hand watering instead of turning on the sprinkler system uses less water and makes you to pay attention to your individual plants. Another great water conserver is mulch: It helps keep evaporation in check and also breaks down slowly to create humus to enrich the soil.
