Maintenance

Shorter days and cooler weather may lull us into thinking we can let up on watering - check the ground an inch below the surface to make sure the ground is moist beneath the surface. The flower buds are growing now and need water. Along with your rhodies, please check your trees. 5 years of drought are taking a toll on our trees. Make sure they will be around for years to come by keeping them watered: infrequent but deep watering is best.
