MAINTENANCE

Don Wallace of Singing Tree Nursery gives us great advice in his weekly newsletter for fall garden maintenance & winter prep:

When you add mulch before the winter rain or snow, you will be giving your plants a big boost. You may not recognize some of your plants come spring as the mulch will give them so much energy to expand their roots, the top growth will be lush and dark green. If you want to fertilize with a slow release blend, choose one with low numbers like 2-10-10, as this will not stimulate late growth as the weather cools.
